The Secretariat of the Assembly of States Parties presents its compliments to States Parties and, on behalf of the President of the Assembly, has the honour to refer to its note verbale ICC-ASP/19/SP/01, dated 20 December 2019, and resolution ICC-ASP/3/Res.6 on the procedure for the nomination and election of judges of the International Criminal Court, as amended by resolution ICC-ASP/18/Res.4, as well as to its note verbale ICC-ASP/19/SP/20 of 31 March 2020 by which it informed States Parties of the decision of the Bureau to extend the nomination period until 30 April 2020 as an emergency extension due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Secretariat wishes to inform States Parties that, as at 30 April 2020, the status of nominations was as follows:

As indicated in the table above, not all minimum requirements for the nomination of judges have been met. Under the terms of paragraph 11 of resolution ICC-ASP/3/Res.6, the nomination period for the election of judges has therefore been extended to Thursday, 14 May 2020. States Parties are requested to transmit nominations by courier or, preferably, via fax (+31-70-515-8376) or via e-mail to [asp@icc-cpi.int](mailto:asp@icc-cpi.int), to be received by the Secretariat of the Assembly before midnight (Central European time) on 14 May 2020. If feasible, the Secretariat would appreciate receiving digital versions, preferably the Word versions, of the nominations.
