The Secretariat of the Assembly of States Parties presents its compliments to States Parties and, on behalf of the President of the Assembly, has the honour to refer to its note verbale ICC-ASP/16/SP/07, dated 7 March 2017, and resolution ICC-ASP/3/Res.6 on the procedure for the nomination and election of judges of the International Criminal Court, adopted by the Assembly of States Parties on 10 September 2004. Under the terms of paragraphs 11 and 12 of the aforementioned resolution, the Secretariat wishes to inform States Parties that, as at 16 July 2017, the status of nominations for the election was as follows:

As indicated in the table above, not all minimum requirements for the nomination of judges have been met. Under the terms of paragraph 11 of the resolution, the nomination period for the judges has been extended to Sunday, 30 July 2017. States are requested to transmit nominations by courier or, preferably, via fax (+31-70-515-8376) or via e-mail to asp@icc-cpi.int, to be received by the Secretariat of the Assembly before midnight (Central European time) on 30 July 2017. If feasible, the Secretariat would appreciate receiving digital versions, preferably the Word versions, of the nominations.
