

# Using LHF Shogun in FlexiSign & Omega

---

## FlexiSign

By default FlexiSign changes the height of all fonts, using the uppercase “X” as to determine the height for all letters. Since LHF Shogun Spurs Convex is not the same height as LHF Shogun Spurs Base, the two fonts will not align properly if you allow FlexiSign to do this.

To overcome this problem, follow these steps:

1. Go to **Edit > Preferences**
2. Click on the **Tools** tab
3. On the right side, check **“Use Font Height”**

This will force FlexiSign to use the true height of the fonts and not resize them. This is an important step for all multi-part fonts.

## Omega

By default, Omega's font converter uses the uppercase “H” to determine the height of the font when converting. Because the LHF Shogun Spurs Base and LHF Shogun Spurs Convex fonts are different heights, converting them using the uppercase “H” will result in the two fonts not aligning properly.

To overcome this problem, we've placed a box on the asterisk ( \* ) key. When converting the font, tell the converter to use the asterisk, instead of the “H” to set the height of LHF Shogun Spurs Base and LHF Shogun Spurs Convex. This way these two fonts will be converted at the same height and will align properly with one another.
