# **President's Message**

The year 2014-2015 for Wikimedia India has been a period of immense growth for the organisation. This growth wouldn't have been possible without the solid foundation set up by the founding members & past office bearers. We would also like to thank the current office bearers, staff, volunteers & other well-wishers for continuing to support the chapter so that it could continue to support the Wikimedia movement in India. The new Executive Committee which got elected in 2014 consists of many young members who bring with them new enthusiasm to the board.

This year also was a huge year of learning with a lot of progress & successes coupled with challenges which I shall be briefing below:

## Finance

With the successful FDC grants application approved by Wikimedia Foundation for 3,325,000 INR was approved in December 2013, we received its first instalment of 1,794,382.00 INR was received by the end of July 2014.

## Staff

As included in our FDC grant proposal, we had intended to hire a Program Director. For this, the Executive committee formed an Interview committee consisting of Sudhanwa Jogalekar (Past president), Navin Francis (Past Secretory), Moksh Juneja (President) and Jayanta Nath(Executive Committee member). After 3 rounds of interviews, Mr Ravishankar Ayyakannu was finalized Ravishankar joined Wikimedia India on 20th September 2014 as Program Director. He will be based in Bangalore. His primary roles are supporting community members in organizing and executing the various chapter programs, strategic planning for the chapter, mentoring interns and devise success measurement metrics for community projects.

## **Community Building**

The Wikimedia chapter always believes that it can facilitate closeness of the Wikipedian network and recognize significant contributors by bringing community members together to share best practices. This aim by Wikimedia India was achieved by organizing conferences at national and regional level. By finding like minded people with whom community members can build collaborative projects, Wikimedia India have been involved in the organizing & support of many events, workshops this year. We will go into a more detailed discussion later into the report.

These events include anniversary celebrations, planning of meetups, workshops & events catering to most of the Wikimedia communities in India. By doing all this, the Wikimedia chapter has gained a good rapport & support from the communities at large as well as the individual members from them.

## **Capacity Building**

The Wikimedia Chapter in the current year has an aim to improve & increase participation in Wikimedia projects and improve its quality of content. To facilitate this, we have conducted many edit-a-thon & photography contests in various Indian communities like Punjabi & Bengali community. These shall be discussed in depth later in the report

## Working with CIS-A2K

## Challenges

Wikimedia India was faced with many challenges in the year. Not initiating proposed programmatic activities due to frequent change of leadership / composition of chapter's executive committee and other issues was a major setback. This also resulted in disconnect with some parts of the community for a while. However, India Community Consultation 2014 and the emergence of new and stable executive committee after WMIN elections in November 2014 has restored faith in the chapter. The faith has been reciprocated by the chapter getting more active with programmatic activities and community support.

Volunteer burnout and retention of members within the Wikimedia communities continue to be a big issue like previous years. We have made several attempts to improve inclusion in the chapter and combat burnout. More such attempts would be required in the coming years in order to stabilise our volunteer base.

### **Continuation of Key role**

In the year 2014-2015, Wikimedia India continues to play an important role in promoting the movement across India panning across languages, culture & regions.

## **Community Consultation**



India Community Consultation 2014 was a strategic community consultation about the future of Wikimedia work in India, which was held in <u>Bangalore</u> on October 4th and 5th 2014.

WMF organized the consultation which was assisted by WMIN. This consultation was attended by 15 Indic language communities & other affiliates of India

WMIN proactively organized a meeting between existing EC, founding members and visiting WMF staff.

Based on this a Condensed proposed roadmap for Wikimedia work in India was created. The roadmap identified 3 main areas

- Programs/Projects/Activities-what we are DOING out there, mostly off-wiki
- Community-organizing and Community health-how we are BEING in our communities, mostly on-wiki
- Norms and expectations in the movement- how we are RELATING to other movement actors

Within these 3 areas, the roadmap plan has been divided into 3 sections

#### Infrastructure Scholarship

Wikimedia India runs Equipment Lending and Community Support program for established Wikimedians to retain and enable them to be more active. This is mainly intended at removing limitations in contributing for user groups like students, unemployed and others facing financial constraints. Reference books, laptops, internet connection, camera and lens were provided as part of equipment lending programme to emerging and prominent wiki editors. #### Bengali Wikipedia 10th Anniversary celebrations

Bengali Wikipedia 10th Anniversary Conference is a gathering of the Bengali Wikimedia Community. This conference is one of the first regional Wikimedia conference of its kind in the India. The program of this conference will be devoted to topics concerning the Wikimedia movement in the India, as well as related topics of free culture and digital rights. The conference featured a diverse array of offerings such as keynotes, presentations, panels, and workshop sessions; provide a lounge space and break areas for conference attendees to gather and mingle.The Anniversary Conference was attended by participants, regardless of previous level of involvement with Wikipedia or the Wikimedia projects. Participants were curious & enthusiastic getting engaged meaningful conversation about the Wikimedia movement in the India, free culture and digital rights, advocacy and outreach, community building, and technology.
